UPDATES from area libraries:

Onslow County will have a guest speaker, Ginger Smith, and she will talk about DNA testing, June 12th, from 10 a.m. to 12 p.m.

Patricia Dew mentioned that NHCPL is building a new branch in the Pine Valley area of Wilmington, which will eventually replace the Myrtle Grove public library branch. Late 2018/Early 2019.

UNCW is having a deep clean of the entire stacks at Randall Library.

Onslow County public library now has "Color Me Calm" for adults who want to color. They offer colored pencils for patrons, and have put some of the colored pages on display.

Lisa Coats mentioned that UNCW offers something similar for students during exams, plus therapy dogs, snacks/coffee/treats. Students also put together entire puzzles during exams as a way to "de-stress."

Roxanne gave us a brief overview/tour of the Tucker Littleton room/Genealogy room. The computers in this room are strictly for genealogy research.
